4-H W.E.T. Team Workshop

Come learn about the water and become part of the WET (Water Education Training) Team on *Wed. & Thurs., Aug. 10 & 11*. Team members will participate in hands-on learning about the water cycle, aquifers, and conservation in order to help teach during Water Fairs at local schools. Cost is \$10 per person, and is due <u>by Aug. 5</u>. This is a great science and leadership training!

4-H Food Project Leader Training

Texas 4-H Participation Fee

The Texas AgriLife Extension Service, just like many other agencies, is struggling with reduced state and federal funding. A partial cost recovery effort has been initiated, and Texas 4-H members will now pay a participation fee of \$25 per member, which will be discounted to \$20 if paid between Sept. 1 and Oct. 31.

Enrolling for 2011-12 4-H Year

You may begin re-enrolling on 4-H Connect on August 1. If you have been enrolled in 4-H this year (2010-11), then you already have profiles on 4-H Connect, so please *DO NOT* create new profiles. Go to 4-H Connect (http://texas.4honline.com), select "I forgot my password" and put in your e-mail address. The system will reset your password, which will be e-mailed to you. All you have to do is update your information. Please let us know if you have any trouble logging on. Instructional information including a handout and video are now available. "4-H Welcomes You" Signs

4-H Shooting Sports

Did you know that 4-H has a shooting sports club? Approximately 45% of the homes in the U.S. have firearms. Safe and responsible handling of firearms is vital to prevent accidents at home or next door. We meet twice a month, on the 3rd Thursday for the information/educational 4-H meeting and on the 3rd Sunday, at the Dahlstrom Ranch off FM 967 in Buda for 4 hours of shooting. Shooting Sports includes: Archery, Muzzle Loading, Pistol, Rifle, and Shotgun with qualified instructors for each discipline and Range Safety Officers always present. These disciplines teach safety, concentration, self-discipline, self confidence, goal-setting, decision-making and courtesy to young people as they learn basic skills and build toward more advanced activities. Quality Counts Verification for Major Shows

Starting in 2012, Quality Counts verification will be required for all youth exhibiting livestock (market and/or breeding) at major livestock shows in Texas (including the Ft. Worth Livestock Show, San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo, Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, Star of Texas Fair in Austin, San Angelo Livestock Show, Sandhills Stock Show in Odessa, State Fair of Texas in Dallas, and Heart O'Texas Fair in Waco). The verification process will require junior exhibitors to pass an online test that measures their knowledge on quality assurance and character education content items.

The Quality Counts Program has now been in existence statewide for six years. Over this time, it has reached an average of 30,000 youth per year through the 4-H and FFA Programs. The program outcomes clearly demonstrate youth being more knowledgeable

of best management practices associated with livestock projects. More importantly, the program's impact has demonstrated positive changes in personal character attributes as well as adoption of livestock best management practices.

Over these six years, Quality Counts has been supported and endorsed by every major livestock show in Texas. These livestock shows have been instrumental in helping market the program statewide and have also been a strong partner regarding the educational content developed for the Quality Counts Program. In addition, these livestock shows have fully endorsed this verification process.

Starting in May, youth are able to go online to take the test and become verified. A verification number will need to be provided at the time of making an official entry into a Texas major livestock show. Thus, youth will need to have completed and passed the test before the major livestock show's entry deadline. A passing score has been determined to be 80%.

Youth educators and the major livestock shows in Texas believe strongly in Quality Counts. Collectively, they are confident that this significant step of requiring youth to be "Quality Counts Verified," starting in 2012, will strengthen and enhance the youth livestock program in Texas.

Hays County Livestock Show Validation

Mark your calendars for October 8. This is the date that all sheep, goats, and beef animals will be validated for the Hays County Livestock Show. Validation will take place between 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. at the Hays County Extension Office in San Marcos. Major Show Validation will take place at the same time.

Major Livestock Show Lamb and Goat Validation Tag Order

With the 2010-2011 show season behind us, it is time to begin thinking about the 2011-2012 season. We are now taking orders for lamb and meat goat validation tags for major shows (Fort Worth, San Antonio, Houston, San Angelo, Star of Texas). All orders must

physically be in the Extension Office by August 26 along with payment of \$10.00 per tag ordered.

Tags ordered after this date will be \$20.00 each.

There is no refund policy after orders are placed by our office. Make checks payable to Hays County 4-H Council. Animals validated with major show tags may use that same validation tag for the 2012 Hays County Livestock Show's validation, but they must be validated on the same day as other animals for the Hays County Livestock Show. You can use the enclosed form to order your



tags. No extra tags will be order for major shows! Sheep and goats will be validated on the morning of October 8th at the Extension Office. Please use the order forms attached to this newsletter to order tags.

All breeding sheep that will be shown at San Antonio, San Angelo or Houston must now be validated. See the validation order form on Breeding Sheep for more information. Cost for Breeding Sheep validation tags is \$5.00.

The Beginning Of Texas 4-H

The first county Extension agent in Texas was appointed in 1906, 8 years before the organization of Texas AgriLife Extension Service. Two years later, T.M. (Tom) Marks, county agricultural agent, organized the first boys' "corn club" in Jack County. Marks found that he was more successful teaching new production technology to the youth than to the adults. Within a matter of years, "pig clubs," "beef calf clubs" (Coleman County, 1910) and girls' "tomato clubs" (Milam County, 1912) were also initiated. The stage was set for the rapid expansion of educational programs directed to rural youth. Within a span of 91 years, 4-H enrollment in Texas has grown from the original 25 corn club members in Jack County in 1908 to more than one million youth in 2000! The Texas 4-H Museum is located in Jacksboro (Jack County), the birthplace of 4-H in Texas.


